Postdoctoral research fellowships are available immediately for a 12-month, renewable appointment in the following research concentrations: 1) Animal Models and Molecular & Cellular Neurobiology, 2) Brain Imaging and Cognitive Neuroscience, and 3) Preclinical Pharmacology and Neuroscience.

The UCLA TNDA Program is funded by a NIDA T32 training grant and provides fellows with the integrative knowledge base needed to plan, conduct and obtain independent funding for bidirectional translational studies of drug abuse. Monthly stipends, basic health insurance and travel funds are provided. If selected, applicants must have obtained U.S. Citizenship or established permanent U.S. residency by the time of the appointment.
