A position as Staff Clinician is open within a newly formed Section of the Laboratory of Clinical and Translational Studies (LCTS), National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (NIAAA), National Institutes of Health. This Section includes additional space and clinical research conducted in the Intramural Research Program (IRP) of the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) in Baltimore Maryland. The main goal of the Section is to conduct clinical research on the neuropsychopharmacology of alcohol and drug addiction. The broader NIH Bethesda campus and the NIDA IRP at the Bayview campus in Baltimore, Maryland provide a rich and highly interactive translational environment.

The Staff Clinician will provide patient care and clinical support for clinical research studies conducted with individuals who can be either addicted patients or volunteers (either outpatients or inpatients). The individual will also be involved in the scientific and research program of the Investigators i.e., development and design of protocols and disseminating and publishing the results. The ideal candidate will be a clinician interested providing patient care, but also in a clinical research career in a leading site worldwide for addiction medicine studies.

Duties include (but are not limited to) serving as a co-investigator of clinical studies, performing clinical assessments on research participants, communicating clinical findings to participants, and being involved in publishing clinical research data. The ideal candidate will have a strong interest to work with a multidisciplinary team to investigate novel clinical neuropharmacological approaches for addictive disorders. Salary will be commensurate with experience and accomplishments. Appointment includes federal employee benefits.

Requirements:

The applicant must provide evidence in the submitted materials that he or she has a current license to practice medicine in the United States or must have all of the credentials required by the state of Maryland for licensing to allow the practice of medicine. Board eligibility or certification by the appropriate American Board (for example, psychiatry, internal medicine, family practice) is preferred. Experience in addiction clinical studies is desirable.
