

**Post-Doctoral Clinical Research Fellowship in Treatment-Resistant Mood Disorders and Advanced Therapeutics for Board-Eligible or Certified Psychiatrists.**

The Dartmouth Medical School Department of Psychiatry **Mood Disorders Service** is seeking candidates for a **Post-Doctoral Clinical Research Fellowship in Treatment-Resistant Mood Disorders and Advanced Therapeutics**.

This fellowship provides advanced training in the evaluation and management of patients with treatment-resistant mood disorders, with a specific focus on patients with treatment-resistant depression (TRD). Experience in the use of psychopharmacologic interventions for TRD will be provided by supervised participation in consultation clinics for patients with treatment-resistant mood disorders at Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center and the White River Junction VA. Training and experience in brain stimulation therapies will be obtained by participation in the clinical administration of electroconvulsive therapy (ECT) and transcranial magnetic stimulation (TMS) and active involvement in clinical trials of ECT, TMS and other brain stimulation therapies such as deep brain stimulation (DBS). Additional opportunities to participate in mood disorders research (such as brain imaging studies) will be provided. The fellowship requires a full New Hampshire medical license.
