

Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center (BIDMC) is recruiting a full-time post-doctoral fellow for September 2019 through August 2020 for training in **development and dissemination of evidence based practices for first episode psychosis** (FEP). This person will join a BIDMC-based team dedicated to supporting new FEP program development in Massachusetts (“MAPNET”) and will also serve as the lead clinician on a study developing and testing a new motivational interviewing-based intervention for families of individuals with FEP. This person will have opportunities for advanced training in the Navigate model of coordinated specialty care for FEP and in motivational interviewing.

The position is situated in the Department of Psychiatry at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center, located on the Harvard Longwood campus in Boston. The fellow will be recommended for an academic appointment as a research fellow at Harvard Medical School and will receive ample encouragement and mentorship to pursue scholarly publications. The right candidate will be highly organized and motivated with a warm and professional interpersonal style. Salary is commensurate with NIH standards (\$50,004 annually). The fellow will have access to BIDMC’s employee benefits plan.

Key Responsibilities Include:

- Training clinicians at FEP programs on collecting and using treatment outcome data
- Visiting FEP programs in Massachusetts to offer support and consultation for collection of treatment outcome data
- Delivering a brief motivational interviewing-based intervention to participants in a research study for family members and significant others of individuals with FEP
