## Faculty Position Announcement

The Depression and Anxiety Center for Discovery and Treatment (DAC) and the Anne and Joel Ehrenkranz Laboratory for the Study of Human Resilience are accepting applications for a full-time, tenure-track Assistant Professor of Psychiatry to lead a program of patient-oriented research in the areas of mood, anxiety, and stress.

DAC is a major clinical research center within the Department of Psychiatry at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai. The Department—ranked #4 in NIH funding with over \$55 million in grants in 2019—is home to a diverse set of clinical research centers organized around major disease areas in psychiatry, with DAC representing depression and related mood and anxiety disorders. DAC's overall goal is to fundamentally advance the treatment of depression, anxiety and related disorders through innovative clinical and translational research, and to provide exceptional evidence-based clinical care to patients. Our vision is to relieve the suffering of patients with depression, anxiety, and related disorders through the discovery of essential disease mechanisms leading to breakthrough treatments. As one of DAC's key constituents, the mission of the Ehrenkranz Laboratory is to drive scientific discovery aimed at understanding the nature of human resilience and how resilience can be enhanced to prevent or treat common and disabling mental disorders, including depression, anxiety, and PTSD.

The successful candidate will conduct creative, high impact clinical and patient-oriented research in a vibrant, interdisciplinary research environment. DAC fosters synergy among both clinical and basic researchers through sharing ideas and resources in a team-oriented setting. Candidates will be encouraged to collaborate with faculty across departments, and to utilize resources throughout the school, including the Friedman Brain Institute and the Biomedical Engineering and Imaging Institute.

**Applicants must have an MD or PhD, have completed residency and/or postdoctoral training in clinical research, and have demonstrated substantial potential to develop and lead a program of research aligned with the missions of DAC and the Ehrenkranz Laboratory.
