



## Perinatal Psychiatry Postdoctoral Research Fellowship

The Department of Psychiatry's <u>Women's Behavioral Health Research Division</u> at the <u>Zucker Hillside Hospital</u> at <u>Northwell Health</u> is offering a new 12-24 month Perinatal Psychiatry Postdoctoral Research Fellowship. Our research is focused on the pathophysiology of perinatal mood and anxiety disorders and novel therapeutic development (pharmacotherapies and neurostimulation). Our research division uses techniques from psychoneuroendocrinology, neuropsychopharmacology, neuroimaging and neurostimulation. Applicants should be ABPN board eligible/certified and prior experience in perinatal (reproductive) psychiatry and clinical/neuroimaging or neurostimulation research is preferred.

The Women's Behavioral Health Division includes our NIH-supported <u>Women's Behavioral Health Research Program</u> and the <u>Perinatal Psychiatry Center</u>, a growing ambulatory specialty Center which articulates closely with our 22-bed inpatient psychiatry Women's Unit with perinatal focus. The division closely collaborates with the Department of OB-GYN which delivers nearly 38,000 babies annually (1% of all national births), with Northwell's Katz Institute for Women's Health and with the Feinstein Institutes for Medical Research.

The fellow will work closely as part of our multi-disciplinary clinical and research team. Our division includes reproductive psychiatrists, nurse practitioners, perinatal psychologists, social workers and licensed mental health counselors, fMRI/cognitive neuroscientists, an MR physicist, research assistants/coordinators, post-baccalaureate visiting research scholars, medical student research scholars, perinatal psychiatry research-track psychiatry residents and psychology (clinical) postdoctoral fellows. The fellow will attend formal weekly research and clinical seminars (i.e. journal club, presentations, team meetings, supervision) and will have research and clinical responsibilities focused within perinatal psychiatry.

The fellow in this position will be expected to collect, analyze and interpret research data related to specific reproductive psychiatry research projects, follow and adhere to experimental protocols in a proficient and meticulous manner, submit grants, submit manuscripts and abstracts for publication to peer review journals and presentations at local, national and international conferences, perform a variety of tasks, including but not limited to, participate in meetings, maintaining records, charts, etc. and will be responsible for clinical and administrative duties, as needed.

The start-date of the fellowship is flexible, and applications will be accepted until the position is successfully filled.

The Zucker Hillside Hospital is located in Glen Oaks, approximately 15 miles east of Manhattan on the border of Nassau and Queens Counties. The area is noteworthy for desirable housing options in pleasant townships and easy access to diverse Long Island-based recreational activities (e.g. beaches, biking, nature preserves, cultural attractions, and shopping).
